UK Government War Crimes

Suffolk Constabulary Event Number 264 of 23rd March 2009
UK-IPCC Case Refs: 2009/013755 & 2009/013764

I am writing directly to your organisation with regard to the above matter, as I appear to have exhausted all avenues open to me for justice within the UK.

In March of this year I reported ministers (notably Tony Blair and Jack Straw) within the UK government, and others, to the Suffolk Constabulary (where I live) and then in May to the Metropolitan Police (which covers Westminster, where the alleged perpetrators are based) for allegations of genocidal war crimes against the people of Iraq and Afghanistan, as defined by yourselves at the ICC under the Rome Statute.

Not only has the English common law been broken via these reported war crimes but also under the civil legal system of acts & statutes 'given the force of law' by the society that I live within, the alleged war crimes have evidently been committed and the UK 'civil law' has clearly been broken, most notably by contravening sections 51 & 52 of The International Criminal Courts Act (2001), which as you know has earlier been ratified by the UK parliament.

In addition, by refusing to investigate these crimes, constables within both Suffolk Constabulary and the Metropolitan Police, are giving tacit approval for ministers to break both UK and International law with impunity.

Having had no joy with either police force and no satisfactory outcome to my subsequent complaints to the IPCC (Independent Police Complaints Commission) referenced above, I am now seeking to bring a prosecution directly to your court as is my right and duty as a UK citizen, as advised on your web site.

I have attached a copy of my submission to the police forces mentioned above for your information and now look forward to your reply.

I look forward to hearing from you as to your proposed course of action on this case. I

shall be following up regularly with you regarding progress but in the meantime please let me know if I can be of any further assistance in this matter.
